- DWD will submit the WIOA State Plan Modification to US DOL (Department of Labor) and US DOE (Department of Education) by March 15<sup>th</sup>

#### **WIOA Local Plan Modifications & Updates**

- US DOL and DOE have not yet issued state plan guidance
- DWD has not yet issued local plan guidance for PY18

DWD has updated the state ETPL policy via the WIOA State Plan Mod WDA 2 will incorporate updated local processes in WIOA Local Plan




#### **Current Internal Processes:**

- Local ETP Initial Eligibility Application Used to Ensure Complete Information
- Applications for Initial Eligibility Reviewed by PMO
- Applications May be Coded as Needing Expert Review or More Information
- Recommendations are Made to Chief Program Officer
- Once Approved Locally, Applications Sent to DWD for Approval
- Planning Two Information Sessions for ETPL Applicants

### **Individual Training Account (ITA) Policy (Approval Required)**

- Updates clarify that allowable items required for training, such as equipment or books, must be covered by supportive services funds, not ITA funds
- Updates allow ITA usage for WIOA Youth Participants, previously excluded
- Introduces training funds cap/participant (vs. prior ITA funds cap)

### **Supportive Services Policy (Approval Required)**


• Updates clarify that allowable items required for training, such as equipment or books, must be covered by supportive services funds, not ITA funds

### **Youth Incentive Policy (Approval Required)**

• Updates clarify which activities can be incentivized, as allowed by WIOA Final Rule






