## A Day in the Life of a Youth Program Manager

- Supervise work direction and performance of the youth program specialists
- Team up with the Programs Director and staff to advise and plan youth program objectives
- Collaborate efforts with internal Employ Milwaukee teams such as Business Intelligence, Business Solutions, and Fund Development to increase overall access to programs and services for youth
- Guide program staff on summer and year-round youth employment programs by developing cooperative relationships with schools, community-based organizations, and the private sector
- Partner with the Fund Development team to seek and provide programmatic information on opportunities for new funding
- Coordinate worksite visits and state/federal contracts for youth programs with program staff
- Direct and coordinate staff, data systems and procedures related to processing and tracking of subcontracts, agreements, and grant activities
- Manage and monitor data collection and programs under state and federal data collection systems such as Efforts to Outcomes (ETO)
- Participate in internal or external audits of department grants/contracts by providing information, documentation, and actions required by the review

## What do I need to be a Youth Program Manager

- Bachelor's Degree required; Master's preferred
- 3 years of program management experience
- Confident, articulate and professional public speaking, presentation and human relations skills
- Clear and concise writing skills business correspondence, reports, procedure manuals
- Proven ability to empower youth and partner with adults, both of diverse socio-economic backgrounds
- Create budgets, manage goals and objectives
- Analytical skills; analyze and interpret charts, graphs, and complex documents
