Kristen Holtz leads Employ Milwaukee's Youth Apprenticeship consortium, the Career Plus Youth Apprenticeship Network, which manages Youth Apprenticeships in Brown Deer, Glendale, West Allis-West Milwaukee, and at Nicolet High School.

As the workforce board representing Workforce Development Area 2 in Wisconsin, we believe in the sector-driven Youth Apprenticeship programming delivered by the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development. We knew there are school districts, private sector schools, and charter schools that were not part of the existing Youth Apprenticeship Consortia.

In order to expand the availability of



programming to these schools and students, and to increase the supply of Youth Apprentices for Milwaukee County businesses, Employ Milwaukee started the Career Plus Youth Apprenticeship Network. Plans are underway to expand to additional districts in the 2018 - 2019 school year.

The DWD YA program is a talent development strategy for local employers. Kristin helps students gain valuable skills while they complete high school. She says, "It is rewarding to connect students

with employers who value their unique skills and want to grow their talents."


